PSC Partners Selected for CZI Rare As One Project Grant





The Chan Zuckerberg Initiative (CZI) announced funding to 30 patient-led organizations, including PSC Partners Seeking a Cure, that are working to find treatments and cures for rare diseases. These grants are part of CZI's Rare As One Project aimed at supporting and lifting up the work that patient communities are doing to accelerate

research and drive progress in the fight against rare diseases.

"We were so excited to have the opportunity to apply for this important grant, and we're thrilled to be part of the group selected. The grant will enable us to take a significant step forward in our search for treatments and a cure for primary sclerosing cholangitis (PSC)," says PSC Partners CEO Ricky Safer. "Thank you to everyone in the PSC community who has contributed to our success. We couldn't do it without you."

The funds, which are designated for one particular research initiative, will be distributed over a two-year period.

What is the PFDD Meeting, Why Should You Be There, and How Can You Help?



When is the PFDD Meeting? The PSC Partners Externally-Led Patient Focused Drug Development (PFDD) meeting, hosted by PSC Partners, is on Friday, October 23, 2020, in the Washington, D.C., area.

What is the PFDD Meeting? This is a one-time opportunity for our patient voices to be heard by attendees who will include the FDA, pharmaceutical leaders, researchers, and clinicians.

Who should be involved? We are hoping for participation by as many PSC patients and caregivers as possible, so please save the date and plan to attend in person or via webcam. Facilitated discussions will

happen, so patients and caregivers in the audience can share their stories, thoughts, perspectives.



How can you become a panelist? To prepare for the PFDD meeting, we will be choosing two panels of adult PSCers and one panel of pediatric PSCers and/or their parent to tell the story of their PSC journey.

If you would like to be considered as a panelist, please capture your story on one page (approx. 500 words), and send it to us. You have a choice of one of two topics to cover that have been designated by the FDA.

Please Pick One of these Angles for Your Story:

- 1. "How does PSC affect your life, including physical, emotional, and social aspects, and what is important to you?" Tell us what is most bothersome... How it affects you to be fatigued, to itch, to not be able to socialize like you used to, to be unable to think clearly, or whatever is most important to you. Everyone is different, and we need multiple voices to express what PSC does to the individuals suffering from it.
- 2. "In addition to a cure for PSC, what treatment benefits doyou hope for, what are the risks you are willing to tolerate, and/or how could medicine improve your quality of life?"

More about your story submission and being a panelist:

- We are hoping to put together diverse panels representing different disease stages, ages, and a variety of experiences and concerns.
- If you are chosen as a panelist, you will need to be in the Washington, D.C., area on Oct. 22-23, 2020.
- If you are not chosen, it doesn't mean your story isn't important. Please know that we are dedicated to creating a diverse panel representing the many faces of PSC. If you are not chosen to sit on a panel, we hope you will still plan on participating in the meeting. There will be opportunities for audience participation. It is essential that we have a strong community presence, and that includes YOU!
- Once the panelists are chosen, PSC Partners will pay for their travel and hotel costs for the October meeting. Panelists will also participate in a series of training and preparation meetings by phone, and one in-person meeting on Thurs., April 23, prior to the start of the annual patient/caregiver conference in Denver, if possible.

Attention Coloradans Support PSC Partners When Completing Taxes



Donate to a Colorado Nonprofit Fund is a new option for Colorado taxpayers this year. Here's how it works:

- When you have determined that you will get a Colorado refund, use the "Voluntary Contributions" schedule to choose an eligible nonprofit, including PSC Partners.
- Taxpayers should look for the new additional option of "Donate to a Colorado Nonprofit Fund" on that schedule and

insert all three of the following:

A) Nonprofit's name (PSC Partners Seeking a Cure)
B) Nonprofit's Secretary of State CCSA Registration Number (Our # is 20083006407.)
C) Amount of Donation

Note: Different tax filing software programs (like TurboTax) will display prompts for tax filers getting refunds in various ways, and donors will have to look for "Donate to a Colorado Fund." If you are using a tax preparer, like H&R Block or a CPA, you will need to inform the tax preparer to include the nonprofit's name, CCSA registration number, and amount.
