Thank you for reaching out with questions/comments about why your provider and/or healthcare organization is not on our newly created PSC Provider Map (U.S.). This map is a living document. We expect updates and changes, and that's why we truly appreciate your input.

If your provider/healthcare organization is not on this list, it does NOT mean that they aren't capable or qualified to treat you or the individual with PSC. Providers represented on the map have met the following criteria:

- 1. Their specialty is relevant to PSC (hepatology, gastroenterology, etc.).
- They treat a moderate to high number of PSC patients. This number is determined by tracking the PSC-specific ICD-10-CM code (K83.01) providers use to identify a patient's diagnosis.
