Diagnose liver disease and/or extent

Liver Transplant Evaluation continued...

- > Progressive, advanced and incurable liver disease
- Selection conference
 - Team decision

Then what happens?

- > UNOS waiting list
- > Blood type, size
- Waiting time varies
 - MELD score
 - total bilirubin, INR, creatinine
 - PELD score for children < 12 years
 - total bilirubin, INR, albumin, height, weight

Considerations

- Financial, before and after transplant
 - Insurance
 - Medication coverage
 - Travel/lodging

Taking Care of Yourself

Fatigue

- Common
- Inactivity increases fatigue
- Move a little
- Rest when you need it
- Sleep
- Keep a positive attitude
- Keep your mind busy

Taking Care of Yourself...

Nutrition

- Eat nutritionally
- Nutritional supplements
- Low sodium
- Small amounts of protein
- Vitamins as recommended
- Small, frequent meals

Medications

> Pill box
> Medication schedule
> List in purse or wallet
> Take with food if allowed
> Know name, dose, frequency, side effects
