[Research Update: UDCA and Biliary Injury](#)


A preliminary study was recently published with some surprising and exciting findings about Ursodeoxycholic Acid (also known as Urso, or UDCA) and PSC. This study was partially funded by a PSC Partners research grant awarded in 2013 to Dr. Heather Francis.

The small study looks at the effects of UDCA on PSC from the perspective of histamines that produce inflammation. From their studies on mice that are modified to simulate PSC and from studying PSC patients' live samples, the results indicated that UDCA was reversing biliary injury and fibrosis both in the mice and in human PSC.
